Dear Devotee,

Re: Sri Vakrathunda Vinayagar Temple renovations

We write to inform you of the exciting work that is being undertaken in the Temple.

As the first Hindu Temple and only Ganesha Temple in Victoria, we are proud to announce that construction of all the Shrines in granite has already begun in earnest. When completed, this will be the largest Temple of its kind in the Southern Hemisphere.

Granite as you may be aware is a 'living' stone, able to absorb all the vibrations of the chanting and devotees' prayers. This is the reason it was used in most temple constructions in the olden days. Equally importantly, the Temple will be a long-lasting temple, as we can witness those in India and Sri Lanka constructed out of granite.

A synopsis of our plans are as follows:

- The entire Moolasthanam will now be constructed in full granite imported from Salem in Tamil Nadu. The new structure will be like our existing temple in the great Chola tradition. It will have 16 Ganeshas in different forms, will have the decorations for the Kostum Vigrahams and the Main Ganesha at the top of the Moolasthanam will be adorned with a beautiful Makarathoranam (Decorations around the Vinayagar) At the rear of the temple too, there will be Sri Vakrathunda Vinayagar. All around the temple there will be 26 pillars engraved into the Moolasthanam.
- 2. The Sri Sivan, Sri Ambal and Sri Chandikeswarar Shrines too will be in full granite. The Sri Sivan and Sri Ambal shrines will also be taller than presently. All around the shrine decorations typical of the Chola tradition will also be included. All around the Sivan and Chandikeswarar Shrines, there will be 8 Rishabams. Around the Ambal there will be 8 Simhams.
- 3 The Durga Shrine will also be in full granite. This Shrine too will have statues of the Sri Durga on the roof in the front and on all the other three sides will have statues of Sri Chamundi, Sri Vaishanavi, and Sri Brahmi. On all corners, there will be 8 Simhams (lions).
- 4 The Murugan Shrine in granite will also depict a 2ft Murugan with Valli and Deivanai on the roof in the front, and will have Statues of Sri Thandayathapani, Sri Balamurugan and Sri Karthikeyan. The corners will be adorned by 8 peacocks.



- 5 Sri Nagathambiran, Sri Hanuman, all the Navagrahams and Sri Vairavar will all be in granite. The shrines will be adorned with decorations typical of Indian temples.
- 6 The Kodisthamba Vinayagar will also have a new small granite shrine, which will make it exquisite and creative.
- 7 Overall the granite work will be unique, in their own way and will blend with the overall temple architecture. Thereby enhancing the look and grandeur of our, Sri Vakrathunda Vinayagar Temple..
- 8 As devotees would have noticed, a new construction is underway at the back of the temple. This will house the Nagathambiran and Hanuman Shrines. Also, there will be a Vahana Saalai, (a place to keep all the vehicles of the deities)) a Madapali (a place where food is cooked for the deities), a Thivasham Room (a place for the people to perform rights for their ancestors) and a cool room primarily to store flowers, and milk.
- 9 The Vasantha Mandapam, will be expanded to include all the Utsava Moorthis and will be clearly demarcated away from the rest of the temple.
- 10 The Navagraham will be moved further back to allow more space within the temple.

As a devotee of this temple we request you to be part of this great endeavour and donate generously towards building this 1000-year temple.

Glossary of some of the terminology used above:

Athara Beedam- The single piece granite stone on which the deity will sit or stand.

Nilai Kaal- The granite stone that is usually placed at the entrance of each shrine, where it is stated Luxmi resides. There will be four pieces for each entrance.

Kodi Mara Vinayagar- The Ganesha deity at the foot of the Kodmaran (Djusthambam), Flagpole

Rishabam- The carving of a Cow (the vehicle of Sri Sivan).

Kalasam- They are in the form of inverted pot, with pointed head facing the sky, is one of the prominent symbols of temples. Usually made from copper and often gold plated.

Simham- The carving of a lion (the vehicle of Sri Durga).

Gomukai- The granite structure from which the abhishega liquid comes out from the shrine.Usually made out of granite

Lotus around the Gomukai - The granite structure around the Gomukai so that the abhishega liquid does not spill everywhere.

Kostum Deities- These are the deities around the Moolasthanam, such as, Nirthana Ganapathy Vishnu, Thedchanamoorthy, Vishnu Durga and Brahma.
