Navarathri

This year's Navarathri festival took place from 10 to 19 October, featuring about 10 music and dance schools from Melbourne.



Maha Ganapathy Homam

The Maha Ganapathy Homam took place on Sangadahara Sathurthi Day (28 October). Lord Ganesha's mantras were repeated 40,000 times by priests throughout the day and at one point, devotees could see Lord Ganesha on the Homam itself. Annathanam was then served to devotees after the final Homam.



Deepavali

For Deepavali this year, the Temple was open all day and many people came to receive Pillayar's blessings.

Kantha Sashthi
